



**1 National Museum of the United States Air Force**

Get a sweeping view of Air Force and military aviation progress—from the earliest days to advanced technology—at the largest and oldest museum of its kind in the world.

**2 National Aviation Hall of Fame**

Meet the heroes and heroines of aviation and space travel—and explore the history of aviation—at this facility located within the National Museum of the United States Air Force.

**3a Dayton Aviation Heritage National Historical Park**

*Wright-Dunbar Interpretive Center and The Wright Cycle Company*  
Capture the spirit and imagination of three inventive, creative men—aviation pioneers Orville and Wilbur Wright, and writer Paul Laurence Dunbar—whose lives came together in Dayton, Ohio.

**3b Paul Laurence Dunbar State Memorial**

Explore the life, times and creativity of a writer at the vanguard of African-American literature by visiting the restored home where Paul Laurence Dunbar lived his last years.

**3c Huffman Prairie Flying Field Interpretive Center**

Learn more about the place where Orville and Wilbur Wright developed the world's first practical plane... and see the memorial built to honor their lives and accomplishments.

**3d Huffman Prairie Flying Field**

Walk the fields where the Wright brothers spent countless hours flight-testing various models of their aircraft, and at their aviation school training others to take the controls.

**3e John W. Berry, Sr. Wright Brothers Aviation Center at Carillon Historical Park**

See the original 1905 Wright Flyer III, originally restored under the supervision of Orville Wright, and gain a new appreciation for the lives and accomplishments of the Wright brothers through other exhibits.

**4 The Wright B Flyer**

Experience the thrill of actually flying in a replica of the Wright B Flyer, the first mass-produced airplane in the world, along with other historical displays.

**5 The Wright Flyers 1899–1905 at Wright Brothers Aeroplane Company**

Schedule an appointment to see Wright gliders and flyers, flight simulators, and other incredible artifacts that bring the accomplishments of the Wright brothers to life.

**6 WACO Museum & Airfield**

Take a flight back in time to the glory days of WACO aircraft, built in Troy from 1923 to 1946, with the museum in downtown Troy and the airfield just south of town.

**7 Armstrong Air & Space Museum**

Celebrate the accomplishments of the first man to walk on the moon, Neil Armstrong, a native son of Wapakoneta... and explore aviation and aerospace history.

**8 Wright State University Wright Archives**

Gain new insights into the extraordinary accomplishments and everyday lives of Orville and Wilbur Wright with more than 6,000 photos, books, journals and other historical documents.

**9 Aviation Trail, Inc. Visitor Center & Museum**

Learn more about the development of manned flight, and Dayton's critical role in the history of aviation in a number of ways, including parachute development.

**10 Grimes Flying Lab Foundation**

Schedule a visit to see the aircraft that lighted the way to developments in aircraft lighting, and learn more about Warren G. Grimes, the man who dedicated his life to making flight safer at night.
